Dear colleagues,

To complement the usual submission process, through which authors can submit their finished papers, IJAR – International Journal of Action Research is opening a call for papers for authors willing to check if an idea for a paper fits into the goals of the journal.

We are looking for papers and perspectives from all over the world that address action research in organizational and work environments, territorial development and other forms of societal transformation. We welcome self-studies, auto-ethnography, indigenous research and participatory and emancipatory methodologies focused on dialogues between theory, practice and participation. We also welcome papers discussing basic epistemological and methodological challenges in approaches like those mentioned.

The journal is problem driven; it is centered on the notion that organizational, regional and other forms of social development should be understood as multidimensional processes and viewed from a broad socio-ecological, participative and societal perspective. We are interested in pertinent papers from action researchers with diverse backgrounds and experiences, including those working from outside of academia on practice-oriented projects.

If you think that you have an idea that could fit into this scope, you can get in touch and submit an abstract of 1-2 pages to lhersted@ikl.aau.dk. In case of acceptance of the proposal by the editors, the invitation to submit a contribution will then follow. The elaborated articles with a maximum length of 7.500 words will then undergo a double-blind peer review and, if accepted, will be published in one of the upcoming issues.
