**ZRex**

Call update: Due to the Russian aggression war against Ukraine, we invite interested authors from all disciplines to submit scientific contributions (theoretical or empirical) dealing with the extreme right in Russia or/and Ukraine.

Contributions to ZRex can be submitted as full papers at any time. *For contributions that will appear in issue 5 (publication planned for March 2023), we ask for submission by 30 June 2022.*

Original contributions only will be published in the journal. By submitting their manuscript, authors declare that their contribution has not already been published or submitted elsewhere. The selection process is anonymous, i.e. the contributions are reviewed anonymously. Therefore, please avoid using the author's name, conspicuous self-citations, project names, comments, etc. in the text that might indicate authorship.

Length of contribution: 30,000 to max. 50,000 characters including spaces, footnotes, bibliography and additional information. For further information, please consult our manuscript instructions: <https://www.budrich-journals.de/index.php/zrex>.

ZRex is open to overlapping and adjacent fields of research where there is a connection to the extreme right, e.g. research on anti-Semitism, racism, Nazism, and aims to establish a bridge between national and international research. The regional focus is on Europe and the USA, but ZRex is also open to examples from other regions of the world. English-language contributions, the international advisory board and the consideration of international references in the selection and review of contributions are central elements for the internationalisation of German-language specialist debates in ZRex. The interdisciplinary journal is open to topic-related submissions from any discipline in areas of empirics, methodology and theory, as well as application-related contributions with diverse subject matter. Possible topics could be:

- current developments, e.g. on the extreme right and the Covid 19 pandemic
- historical and current analyses of the development of extreme right organisations, parties and movements
- right-wing extremism in parliaments and governments
- history of ideas, production of ideology and discourse strategies of the far right
- right-wing extremist and group-based anti-human attitudes
- individual, collective and societal right-wing radicalisation
- right-wing violence, right-wing terrorism and hate crime
- anti-Semitism and racism
- gender and right-wing extremism
- influences and connections between manifestations of right-wing extremism and social cohesion
- digitalisation of right-wing extremism
- interactions between right-wing extremism and religious fundamentalism
- international developments and comparisons
- local and country comparisons
- network analyses
- practical reflections and evaluations of countermeasures
- literature reviews
